We used the story of the Enormous Turnip to provide drama and writing opportunities this week. The children have learned some new drama techniques to help them explore the story characters and the main events. We have also heard and compared different versions of this traditional tale.

In maths we explored doubling quantities. The children doubled by adding spots to the other side of ladybird pictures, they also used compare bears to double quantities and tried to record in a number sentence. We also learned a new song "Mr Double Trouble" to help us remember doubling facts.

We have been finding out about plants and how they grow. We have been talking about the needs of plants and how we can look after our own seeds and bulbs. The children have been busy gardening outside and have all planted a sunflower. They have each created a living field for their clay farm animal. This week the children have also been trying out the new bouncy hoppers and have enjoyed decorating the playground with chalky pictures.
