What a busy few weeks – such a lot of varied and interesting activities are happening in school at the moment.

NSPCC workshops in Y5 & 6

Following on from an assembly by representatives of the NSPCC, Year 5 and Year 6 took part in a workshop around their 'Speak up Stay Safe' programme. This session reinforced important messages about what the NSPCC do; who it involves and how it can help children who are in vulnerable situations. The key message to all children was that they should "Speak out and stay safe". Each child took home a 'Speak out. Stay safe' kit in which they can record the people, places and things that make them feel happy and safe. The children were encouraged to keep their kits safe and use them as a reminder of what they can do if they feel sad, worried or unsafe. This is what the children said:

"It has enhanced our knowledge of being able to keep safe and healthy."

"We know there are people who will listen to any concerns we might have."

"It helped us to think about what's right and wrong."



Bring a bear day in Reception

On Friday 23rd January the Reception class had a 'Bring a bear to school day'. All the children brought their favourite bear from home and the children and their bears took part in lots of activities. First of all, in the morning, they all went on a bear hunt around the school grounds. The children then made crowns and labels for

their bears. After lunch, the children made honey sandwiches and they all had a teddy bear's picnic.



Bentley visit to Year 5

Year 5 were introduced to four Bentley engineers who explained that the company were considering different ways to power a new building currently under construction. After discussing the pros and cons of various power sources, the Bentley crew set a challenge for the class to design and construct an efficient wind turbine.

The children had to think carefully about blade size and shape, how to fix their design to a chassis and how to make it sturdy enough to spin without falling over or being damaged. The winning design would be the one that withheld its structure and could lift the most weight in a cup when spun.

The team of engineers said how well the children worked and how much they were impressed by each groups' design. We've received lots of positive feedback from Year 5 who all agreed that they thoroughly enjoyed the workshop.

Sports hall athletics

On Thursday 19th January, we took a team of 19 athletes from Year 5 and 6 to compete in the Alsager Community Trust Sports hall athletics competition. During the event, participants were tasked with competing in running, jumping and throwing events against 5 other local schools.

There were lots of exemplary performances, with many first and second place finishes in many of the track events. Field events were also strong, as was evident in the soft javelin event at the end of the competition.

The top three finishers had just 20 points between them. Tensions were high as we awaited the results. After the other teams were announced, we discovered that we had come a close 2nd, missing out by just 8 points.

Everybody who participated did Excalibur proud and showed what fantastic, hard-working athletes we have in our school. As usual, a phenomenal attitude was evident throughout the team. Congratulations!
