The excitement continues as our very own 5 hungry caterpillars continue to grow and grow. We are all confidently able to explain their life cycle and we have begun looking at other life cycles too, such as frogs and chickens. It was wonderful this week to observe a group of children playing 'caterpillars and butterflies' outside on the playground. In maths learning we have been adding numbers together and recording in number sentences. We used the story 'Mr Gumpy's Outing' to help us use the vocabulary first, then and now when talking about adding numbers together e.g first there were 2 animals, then there were 3 more, now there are 5 altogether'. We extended this by challenging the children to see if they could work out the 'then' when they knew the 'first' and 'now'. We will be moving onto subtraction stories next week.





Next week we will be using these two stories. We are going to be looking at how we change and grow and what homes were like in the past.
