<u>Reception class admissions 2018 – a reminder</u> <u>from Cheshire East</u>

From 1 September 2017 you can apply online to start school in reception in September 2018. If you are not resident in Cheshire East, but live in another English Local Authority, you must apply via your home local authority even if your preference is for a Cheshire East school. The closing date for applications for Reception class 2018 is **15th January 2018** – any applications received after this date will be treated as late applications. If you have a child (or know anyone who has a child) born between 1st September 2013 and 31st August 2014, the child will be due to start primary school in September 2018.
