Physical Literacy Day

The children in Year 1 to Year 6 recently took part in a range of physical exercises and assessments. These are a series of age appropriate timed tasks and drills. As you know, at the end of last year we sent out information on accessing your child's online 'locker' to see how they are doing and ideas on how to easily increase fitness levels at home. What it helps teachers to do in school is to plan very specific lessons and activities to support the development of core fundamental physical skills; which in turn supports the children's ability to successfully access and participate in a range of sports and develop healthy lifestyles.

<u>Staff Development and school</u> <u>improvement</u>

As an 'outward facing' school, Excalibur is always developing and seeking to improve in any way we can. Staff have ongoing training and networking opportunities throughout the year. Recently, we have had training in: coaching, emotionally healthy schools, food hygiene, global learning, fire safety and reading. All staff had their annual safeguarding refresher training. We have also recently had the autumn term visit from our school improvement partner (SIP). The SIP's role is to quality assure our self-evaluation and school priorities. Our SIP is a current OFSTED inspector. In her report she comments that: "Excalibur is an excellent school that offers a great deal to all of the pupils. Rich and exciting opportunities are used to support learning at every stage...this is a school that everyone is proud of" and on the "ambitious drive to continue to provide the best possible education for all the pupils at the school."
