They were very lucky with the weather and managed to do all their outdoor learning in the morning before the rain started; completing an indoor session with artefacts in the afternoon. Mrs Bailey was thrilled when the staff at the museum (and the Roman soldier) commented that our children were excellent in their behaviour, knowledge and attitude to learning. The DEWA experience staff were so impressed that they said that our Year 3 were welcome back every day and were an absolute pleasure to work with.
