

1.2.This week, we have been learning about real wolves and how they live. We have compared real wolves with story wolves and discussed how they are the same and different. The children had the opportunity to create a wolf wanted poster. They had to think of suitable words to help describe the wolf. We have also continued to record our sorry letters and cards.


In maths, we have looked at different 3D shapes. The children had to decide which shapes would be best to build a house for the three pigs. They were very good at explaining their choices and decided that cubes and cuboids would produce a strong wall. Following on from that we looked at low to lay bricks to give the strongest wall. There was lots of huffing and puffing during the testing! We watched an episode of the Cbeebies programme 'Come Outside' and found out how bricks were made.
