After playing the sport in PE for the last few weeks, and a training session after school last week, the team were keen to test their skills against an opposition. The first game, against Pikemere, gave us a taste of what was to come, with a fantastic display of dodgeball skill and tactics, leading to a victory secured in just a few minutes. The next two matches, against Alsager Highfields and St. Gabriel's Catholic Primary School, were equally enjoyable, with all teams showing a good standard of dodgeball throughout. Winning both matches, the team had a bye, before playing against the final team, and eventual joint runners up, Cranberry Academy.

This match was more difficult, providing some nail-biting moments when defeat looked imminent. But the team struck back, securing a well-earned final victory, and the trophy for the second consecutive year!

On Thursday 15th March, fourteen children from Year 3 and 4 participated in the Alsager Community Trust hockey festival, which was held at Alsager School. #### Science Week

Last week was science week and Mr Hancock and Miss Robinson did some experiments with the children in assembly. They looked at several experiments using balloons and static and 'magic milk' and other interesting things.

In addition, as part of our science week learning every class had the opportunity to take part in a forensic science session with a visiting scientist. A crime had been committed and the children were required to search the crime scene to find clues to help them solve the crime. They discussed what clues they might find at a crime to scene to help them find out who was guilty. Working in teams, each group searched their crime scene for clues and compared the evidence that they discovered to the information they had about each of the suspects. Evidence such as fingerprints, footprints, DNA and clothes all provided clues, there were even some 'red herrings' along the way meaning the children had to decide which pieces of evidence were the key to revealing 'who did it!' Every class worked together brilliantly to solve the crime and thoroughly enjoyed taking on the role of crime scene investigators. When I chatted to the children over lunchtime, they clearly enjoyed the sessions and were full of enthusiasm.
