Reception Class Newsletter

We have begun our "Down on the Farm" theme this week and the children have found out about animal babies. They talked about the adults and noticed how they were the same and different to their babies

In literacy, our focus story was "What the Ladybird Heard". The children discussed the robbers and how they tried to steal the prize cow. We talked about the instructions the robbers had used and how the animals had managed to trick them.

In maths, we focused on directional language including left and right, forward and backwards. The children read instruction cards to direct a partner. We talked about why giving instructions might be important in real life situations. The children enjoyed inputting instructions into Bee Bot (a programmable toy). They learnt how to send the Bee Bot on a journey around a series of obstacles. They also enjoyed using a Bee Bot app on the mini iPads to practise their coding skills. We also had a focus on subtraction, using a number-line to help record our answers.

The children have been finding out about ladybirds and how they grow. They all shared a variety of facts about ladybirds and we used a search engine to find out even more. We looked closely at the ladybird life cycle and the children were surprised by how the larvae were so different from the adult ladybirds.
