A warm welcome back to the start of the summer term! The children were excited to be back at school and were thrilled to start a brand new topic. They could not wait to use our new role-play "Excalibur Vets" and learned how to check in the pets on a vet's treatment form.



In literacy, we have been writing wonderful work for our wall. Some of the children have recorded lists of pets and looked at hearing and recording sounds in order. Other children have recorded sentences about a pet they would buy from the pet shop. Some children recorded a "Guess who?" description so others could try to work out their riddle. We looked at recording sentences which could be read by others and reread them to check that they made sense.

In maths, we have been recording numbers to twenty. We have also been handling data to find out which pets were most popular in our class. The children then displayed the results using 2count on the computers. We have also been singing the months of the year and counting in tens.

We have made the most of the outdoors with a selection of activities including water play, large construction and pavement chalking. The children have also loved using our new fairy toadstool, which was made from an old cable spool. Many thanks Mr Cheadle!
