Reception Class Newsletter

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Welcome back to a most exciting half term. This week has been all about special events; Bonfire night, Diwali and Remembrance.

In literacy, the children talked about the bonfires they had visited and the fireworks they had seen and heard. We thought about words that would help to describe the sound effects of the fireworks. Everyone also enjoyed tracing firework writing patterns.

During topic work, the children have found out about Bonfire night and the story of Guy Fawkes. We have talked about keeping safe during Bonfire celebrations and have read the Firework code. The children have also been busy creating 3D model rockets and chalking and painting firework pictures. We used Purple Mash to make firework pictures and enjoyed building our own bonfires complete with safety barriers in the outdoor area. We made firework sounds in music and sang firework songs too.

In maths, we have explored 2D and 3D shapes. The children found about the properties of 3D shapes and learned to name cubes, cuboids, spheres and cylinders.

In Read Write Inc, the children used letter tiles to spell requested CVC and alien or nonsense words. We have been recapping the sounds we have learned so far and added 'sh' to the sounds we are learning. In Read Write Inc we talk about '2 letters, 1 sound' for sounds that are made up of 2 letters like ch. th and sh.
