News from School

Before schools were closed, as part of their topic on life cycles, Year 5 had acquired several fertilised chicken eggs in the hope of hatching some chicks. On Tuesday 7th April, as Mr. Pickin was working through his cleaning rota, he walked past the closed door of the Year 5 classroom. Faintly, but audibly, he heard what he thought was an alarm going off inside. So, he pushed open the door and followed the noise to the sealed incubator which housed the eggs. As he approached, he realised that there was something moving inside. He removed the lid to find three little chicks visible and one hiding under the plastic shelving which had held the eggs. The chicks, (Jeremy, Audrey, Carol and Crystal-Alexandra) are doing well. Many thanks to Mr. Pickin for rescuing the chicks and Mrs Woodcock for giving them a good home. As part of their learning on life cycles in science, Year 5 also purchased tadpoles and butterfly eggs to observe their changes over time. Over the course of the last few weeks, they have developed as expected: the tadpoles are getting bigger and the caterpillars are now butterflies. They are being well looked after by Miss McArdle.
