

## Planning Template – Film Review

You are aiming for five short sections. The planning template below should guide you with what to include. Use this in conjunction with the **WAGOLL, Phrase and Sentence Bank** and **Film Terminology**.

<u>Section</u>	<u>What to include</u>
1. Introduction	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Hook your reader and make them want to read on.</li></ul>
2. A short synopsis	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- <i>What is the film about?</i> Do this without revealing any spoilers.</li><li>- Summarise the plot – don't go into excessive detail.</li></ul>
3. Interesting information about the film	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Include information about the cast or crew, or any awards the film has received.</li></ul>
4. What you like and dislike and why	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- <i>What do you like about the film? Why?</i></li><li>- <i>What do you dislike about the film? Why?</i></li><li>- Include terminology, or jargon, of the film industry (see <b>Film Terminology</b> document for more information).</li></ul>
5. Summarise	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Briefly summarise your review. Make it an effective, engaging ending.</li></ul>

Essentials:

- Write in first person.
- Write in present tense. Ex. *The film is a masterpiece.*
