
The Industrial Revolution: Diary of a Child Worker



Wednesday 23rd May 1832



Dear Diary,

Today is my 9th birthday. Last night, I wished with all my might that I wouldn't have to work today. Unfortunately, my wish didn't come true. Mum says that the factory owners don't care about birthdays. She was right.

Although I made it in time for work, Growler (I don't know his real name) still held the whip up and waved it in my face as I walked past. When Frank came in late, I could see from the red marks on his legs that he hadn't been so lucky.

When I got home, Mum told me that she had saved my wages from last week to get us some meat scraps from the butcher. Scraps beat gruel any day!

Saturday 9th June 1832




Dear Diary,

There are lots of kids around here who are missing a finger or two and I don't intend on being one of them.







Dear Diary,

It was so hot today that I thought I was going to melt. I spent 12 hours on my hands and knees underneath the machines clearing jams and cotton fluff. I saw several people looking unwell in the stifling heat and I wasn't surprised.

The smell was horrific too. It was the sort of smell that you can taste for hours after you've left. It's not like any of us have running water in our houses either so it will likely still be there tomorrow. Yuck.

Saturday 22nd December 1832



Dear Diary,

I got beaten today. After walking to work in the snow, my hands were numb and stiff. This meant that, at the beginning of my shift, I was struggling to tie the thread together. Growler saw this and said that I wasn't working hard enough. It's not fair.

 - Pupils' own responses provided that a sensible comparison is made between the two days, such as: On the 14th August, it was so hot that Harriet felt as though she was melting. On the 22nd December, it was the opposite because it was so cold that Harriet couldn't move her hands.
