

Another busy week has flown by in Reception. Some of our time has been taken up talking about Harvest and learning a special harvest song. We also talked about yesterday's Chinese 'Mid-Autumn' or 'Harvest Moon' Festival which is celebrated by one of our families. We have been drawing and talking about our families and after listening to a story about 'Stan and his Gran', we talked about our grandmas/nannies/nanas/grans and what we like to do together.


We have been counting forwards and backwards and comparing different quantities as we thought about 'who has more?' We used 5 frames to help us check. A picture has been posted on SeeSaw so you can see what they are and how we used them. We have been busy sorting and weighing objects such as conkers.


FPPOOOCA As you will have seen from SeeSaw we introduced the children to 'Fred' our phonics frog and to our first three sounds in the Read Write Inc. phonics programme; $m$, a and $s$. Although we have shown you the handwriting rhymes, please don't worry if your child has no interest in writing these, especially with a pencil. Some children are more ready than others. There are lots of fun ways to have a go without the use of a pencil such as using shaving foam or gloop (cornflour and water), water and paintbrushes on a wall or the ground, bath chalks or pavement chalks, using a lightsabre or magic wand to make the formations in the air or using a drawing programme on an I-pad or tablet.
