PE kits

As mentioned previously could we ask that **after half term** children come to school with a PE kit that will be left on their peg? It needs to contain a t-shirt and/or shorts and joggers/leggings and a hoodie/warm top as we will be outside as much as possible. Pumps or trainers are fine. We understand that you may wish to have trainers at home as your child may need to wear them away from school. In that case I would suggest ensuring they come to school **every day** in your child's bag. This is so that if the weather is unsuitable for PE on our scheduled days we can still do PE on another day of the week. Getting changed independently and managing fastenings is one of the Early Learning Goals that children are assessed on at the end of the Reception school year so it is an important skill that we need to learn hence the reason behind this change.
