Reading Records

It's been great to read about your experiences of sharing stories at home. Please keep filling them in. Please could you also send the reading record into school every day? There will be times when we write to you so we will need them to be in school.

Phonics Teaching at Excalibur

Phonics is a way of teaching children how to read and write. It helps children hear, identify and use different sounds that distinguish one word from another in the English language. Written language can be compared to a code, so knowing the sounds of individual letters and how those letters sound when they're combined will help children decode words as they read. Understanding phonics will also help children know which letters to use.

At Excalibur we use a programme called 'Read Write Inc' to teach children phonics. You can find out more about the scheme by watching some short videos which can be found on our website http://www.excalibur.cheshire.sch.uk/page/phonics/6373. This week we have begun playing Fred talk games. Fred Talk games are a fun way to teach children how to orally blend sounds into words. Fred instructs children to touch their nose, hands on your head etc. 'Fred says put your hands on your I-e-g'. 'Fred says put your hands on your b-a-ck' or he tells them about his adventures e.g 'Fred saw a h-e-n on the farm'. All children develop at different rates and some of our children are already able to do this. Some children are not able to do this yet but by playing games at home, where you talk like Fred will help all children. We will be posting videos starting from next week on Seesaw to explain more and will be hosting a RWI information evening before half term so please look out for them.
