Key rings

When your child is ready we will give them a keyring with words to learn. These words are often called tricky words or exception words because they don't follow the usual phonic patterns e.g. 'to' or 'the'. As well as these words there will be some words that can be 'fredded' e·g· 'cat' or 'mum'. The words are added a few at a time. A note explaining a bit more about how it works will be stuck into the reading diary when your child gets their keyring. I have found the best way to learn these words is to learn to write them too. Below is the link to a great game to help your child learn them. Choose the 'add my own words' option. Then type in the words from the keyring. My 4 year old has been playing it and it has really helped her.
