As mentioned in the video uploaded to Seesaw yesterday, our sounds this week have been the stretchy sounds 'm' and 's' and the bouncy sounds 'a', 'd', 't'. Some links to short videos will be posted onto Seesaw later today to support the learning that has taken place. These videos are for your child to watch should they wish to. Don't watch them in one go though and if your child isn't interested that's fine. You could challenge your child to find objects that begin with the sounds we have covered. It's better to focus on one letter at a time. Another game to play is i-spy using a group of objects that begin with the 5 sounds we have been learning this week. Challenge your child to find the object that begins with one of the sounds. Don't worry if you child can't do this yet. They are ready when they are ready! Please remember we have an 11 month age span across the class which makes a huge difference developmentally.
