Year 3

Year 3 have been very busy this week. In English, the children have started their new piece of writing. After identifying the features of a non-chronological report, they have been learning how to conduct their own research and make notes about emperor penguins, which they will use to write their own reports. In maths, the children have been continuing to use the grid method for multiplication. They have also been developing their own pieces of music through body percussion. In science, the children have started their new topic all about light. They have been exploring different sources of light and have considered what causes things to be dark. This week, Year 5 have been learning how to multiply using formal methods. The work has been a challenge, but they have all persevered and have achieved well in their learning. In English, Year 5 have been introduced to a new piece of writing which has been based upon the short animation - Lune et L'autre. The children have been exploring various ways to make their writing more descriptive and appealing for a reader. In History, the children applied what they had learnt the week before regarding the events leading up to World War 2. The children considered the question, "Did WW1 cause WW2?" Learning all about the Treaty of Versailles helped to inform the children's answers. In Computing, the children applied the skills of using quotation marks and the Boolean operator, 'AND' to carry out research on a WW2 leader of their choice. The children then presented their research in a fact file. What fabulous learning, Year 5. Well done.

Year 6

This week in maths, our Year 6 children have been securing their understanding of algebra through an array of reasoning and problem-solving questions. In English, in addition to comprehension and guided reading, they have written a narrative piece from the perspective of a character in the Invention of Hugo Cabret. It has been wonderful to read their engaging pieces of writing throughout the week. In other subjects, Year 6 have been busy comparing Charlie Chaplin and the Lumiere Brothers - iconic pioneers of the silver screen. In PE, they continue to practise their juggling skills - they are aiming to learn to juggle by the time they return to school. In art, the children have worked on their understanding of perspective, in preparation for drawing the backgrounds of their own comic-style artwork. To further develop their understanding of human anatomy, the children looked at the structure and function of the heart muscle, and how it pumps blood around the body.
