- "Temperate" means moderate or mild.
- These climates tend to have all four seasons
- Warm or hot summers and cool to cold winters.
- These climates are located between the equator and the poles.

Polar Climate

- This may be the harshest climate on Earth's surface.
- Temperatures can reach as low as -120°F or colder. That is bone-chilling cold!!
- Snow and ice remain year-round (all seasons)

Antarctica only has two seasons: summer and winter. Because it's located in the southern hemisphere, Antarctica's summer is from October to February. During this time, the sun is almost always in the sky. Days rapidly get longer there in summer, until, eventually, the sun doesn't set at all.

January is the warmest month in Antarctica.
