Reception

This week, our Reception children have been incredibly busy again. Their week started by travelling the world using the story 'Poles Apart'. As well as visiting different countries, the children thought about different types of transport. They learned about polar bears and drew and wrote facts about them. The children have also conducted an exciting experiment to investigate why polar bears don't feel the cold. In music, the children have explored tempo, composing their own rhythms and evaluating different ones. Our Reception class have also been thinking about what is good and bad for the world. What a fantastic week of learning in Reception!

Year 1

The children have had a busy week in Year 1. They have been learning about hearing and how sounds can be used to warn people. They have also been thinking about hygiene and how we should look after our teeth. In English, the children have continued their writing based on the story of 'Lost and Found'. This week, the children have learnt how to include speech in a sentence. They have written their own versions of 'Lost and Found', often injecting original ideas of their own!

The stories have been absolutely fabulous! In Maths, the children have looked at number bonds and how they can help us when adding the ones in number sentences. Cosmic Yoga and Go Noodle dances have also been eagerly enjoyed! What a super week, Year 1. Well done for all your effort!

Year 2

This week Year 2 have shown their artistic side again. They drew teddy bears by looking carefully at the shapes. On Wednesday afternoon, they enjoyed a walk around Cardiff, to see the motte and bailey castle, courtesy of Google maps. Next week, they are off to Belfast! Well done, Year 2.

Year 3

This week in maths, Year 3 have been continuing to use number lines for division. They have also been learning how they can use partitioning to help them to solve division problems. In their English sessions, the children have been reading "The Emperor's Egg". They have explored emotions and feelings by using a drama activity to act out the role of a male Emperor penguin taking care of its egg. In art, the children have been learning all about adding shading and tone to their sketches and have created some wonderful pieces of artwork! In addition to this, in science, Year 3 have been learning about light and the differences between night and day. Year 4

In English this week, our Year 4 children have been working incredibly hard in creating an emotive and descriptive piece of writing based on the eruption of Mount Vesuvius. The children had to imagine that they were in the city of Pompeii at the time of the disaster. A difficult task! Miss Taylor and Miss Hilditch were really

impressed by the range of language features that the children had used and emotion included. The class had thought carefully about how it would feel to leave their homes behind. In maths, Year 4 have been exploring the way in which the area of shapes can be measured. The children have worked hard to solve some tricky mastery problems. Well done Year 4. You have worked hard throughout the week.

Year 5

This week, Year 5 have been learning how to divide numbers and then interpret remainders - a tricky area of maths that they have worked incredibly well at. In English, they have been practising finding and writing features of a balanced argument to help them with their writing task next week. They will be discussing whether it was right for children to be evacuated during the war. In other areas of the curriculum, the children have been learning all about stars and constellations. The children have also been comparing two historical sources -Neville Chamberlain's declaration of war and Adolf Hitler's speech, given just before Germany invaded Poland. We thought about how they were different and the children began to consider why that would be the case which led to a discussion about bias in sources. In Computing, the children began working on their timeline PowerPoint, using action buttons to navigate between slides. It really has been a jam-packed week in Year 5!

Year 6

In their fourth week of online learning, Year 6 have been extremely busy. In maths, they have learnt about ratio and proportion and have worked on some reasoning and problem solving questions. In English, following on from their comprehension on Philippe Petit, the children began to practise the skills needed to write a third person narrative piece about a hi-wire walk between New York's twin towers. Throughout this week, the children have been filling in their own diet and exercise diaries, linked with their science topic. This has culminated in a written discussion of their findings. Over their two PE sessions this week, the children have secured their sporting fundamentals through a lesson with SCNW and have continued to practise their Cooper

Run, jogging as far as they can in eight minutes. This week in computing, Year 6 are beginning to work towards the creation of a stop-motion animation. This week's lesson focussed on critiquing existing videos and then planning their own. In French, after two weeks of building the skills needed, the children were challenged to write about their dream home. What a great week of learning Year 6!
