This week ...

Has seen us thinking about wolves. We have been enjoying stories about wolves, in particular Little Red Riding Hood. You made some fantastic models and story maps that you used to retell the story. You came up with some fantastic disguises too as you tried to help Mr Wolf from being spotted quite so easily!

We continued to develop our subitising skills as we talking about noticing what we see and looking for groups of numbers that make larger numbers by asking What do you see and how do you see it?'. In particular we explored the composition of numbers 9 and 10 and ordered numbers to 10, correcting mistakes and competing sequences.
