# Pupil voice - accelerated reader

Parents/Carers will be aware that we have invested in new books throughout the junior classes and introduced Accelerated Reader, which supports the pupil's comprehension of reading. We are already seeing the impact of this. Mrs Tomkinson conducted a series of pupil interviews last week and the children gave their thoughts about this latest initiative. I thought you may like to hear some of the things they said:

Ben – It has made me realise what books are my level and so I am reading more challenging text which has made me a better reader in general.

Layla – I already read lots at home. Now I enjoy reading more at school because the books are better. Guided reading sessions are quieter as people are more engaged in reading.

Molly – It has made me persevere with books to the end and not just give up.

Sophia – It has made me read more which makes me learn more about the world.

Joseph – It helps me to learn more about authors so that I can read more of their books if I like them.
