Feedback	Actions taken
<p>Year 1</p> <p>They all have fun together and enjoy the equipment.</p> <p>To have stronger hoops as the hoops we have are out of shape.</p> <p>To have a hoop peg in the shed.</p> <p>They find that play is too rough in the old fort area.</p>	<p>No action needed.</p> <p>Get some hoops from PE cupboard and move them outside. <i>Some new hoops have been added to the play shed. The ones in there are sturdy.</i></p> <p>Enquire if we can order and install a new hoop peg. <i>I will speak to Mr. Pickin and see if we can have another hoop peg on the left of the shed.</i></p> <p>Any running must now be done outside the old fort area to minimise rough play in KS2. <i>This is now in place and has been explained to Play Team.</i></p>
<p>Year 2</p> <p>They have fun together</p>	<p>No action needed.</p>
<p>Year 3</p> <p>They have fun on the equipment.</p> <p>More litter pickers.</p> <p>Have a girl's football team (not OPAL-related).</p>	<p>No action needed.</p> <p>Enquire with YH if we can order some more litter pickers. <i>There are four litter pickers, which I think is enough. During the next play assembly, I will encourage children to help litter pick. If we find we need more at that point, more will be ordered.</i></p> <p>Email Rob Morris to ask when the cancelled event will be rescheduled. <i>I have emailed Mr. Morris and he has</i></p>

	<i>said that he will try to put the event on. If he does not, we will invite another school to play here in the summer term.</i>
Year 4 Could the path on the field be widened?	This is too cost prohibitive. <i>Unfortunately, the cost would be the same, if not more, than the cost of putting the original path in so this will not be possible.</i>
Year 5 Unable to feedback.	Ask Year 5 to carry out the feedback.
Year 6 New football nets on the field. Different coloured balls for each year group. Could some tunnels go through the shrubs.	Consider whether this is viable. Establish which shrubs this is about? <i>Would you be able to ask them which shrubs this is about?</i>
To have a school pet (not really OPAL-related).	Consider viability of this. <i>This is difficult due to the question of who looks after the animals during holidays. However, Year 5 are growing chicks this term.</i>
