New resources introduced in 2023-2024 (Power of PE) are being fully implemented across school to support teachers in their teaching of PE. Assessment in PE will be fully embedded and used by teachers to accurately assess children. This will be used alongside fitness tests to assess children’s progress and attainment in the subject. Profile of PE is high, with annual Sports Week continuing to provide children with a lifelong love of sport and physical activity. Club links continue to be strong and cover a wide variety of sports and activities. All children will meet the national swimming requirements by the end of Year 6, unless there are compelling reasons for them not to have done.
