Reception Class Newsletter

Happy New Year! We hope you all had a wonderful Christmas and New Year. It is lovely to be back. The children have settled into our school routines very quickly, despite our unexpected closure on Monday.



'We're Going on a Lion Hunt' is our featured story this week. We performed the story every day and have enjoyed going on our own lion, bear or even tiger hunts.



We have begun the New Year, with new RWI groups. The class are now grouped into 4 progress groups. Everyone is doing really well and as we keep saying we are so proud of them all. Some children are ready to read paper ditty sheets, which are read before the first reading books. In RWI terms a ditty is a story made up of a few short unpunctuated sentences. From Monday, those children who are reading paper ditties will bring one home every day until they are ready for the red books. This is usually for 2 weeks. They will continue to bring home the lilac sound blending books too. Sometimes we ask children to reread a book they may have already read. This is to give extra practice until they are ready to move on. These children will be learning the special friends; sh, ch, th, qu, ng and nk which can be found in the back of the green set 1 sound blending books. Other children are developing their oral blending and consolidating sounds they don't know. A final group have begun to read green books and are beginning to learn set 2 sounds. Information about set 2 sounds has been posted onto Seesaw for those children who have started learning them. Look out for supporting resources on Seesaw for all groups.

Maths

This week we have been spotting zero and thinking about its importance as a number. We went on a zero hunt around school, as well as understanding that zero comes before one. We used a number of stories such as 'Zero is the Leaves on the Tree' and 'None the Number' to help us with our learning. We have practising our number formation. Where can you see zero around your home and what does it mean? E.g. if you had 2 bowls, 1 with 5 peas and 1 that was empty you might say 'There are zero peas in the bowl'.
