Our story of the week was 'The Bug Collector'. The children enjoyed talking about the story and understood that the bugs couldn't live in the jars forever. We talked about a sanctuary and what that meant for the minibeasts. Later in the week, the children enjoyed printing tracks with plastic insects. It was very messy but we produced some excellent trails.

On Tuesday, it was time to say goodbye to our butterflies. This fitted in nicely with the story of the week, the children talked about our caterpillars and how we had to release them when they were butterflies. The children enjoyed releasing four butterflies (in total) into the wild. It was lovely to see them fly away!

In maths, we have recapped repeating patterns. The children used shape names and colours to talk about repeating patterns. This week, we also used a colour code to decorate a minibeast picture.
