Dear Parents/Carers,

The weeks are racing by. It seems like such a long time since Christmas!

We have all been extremely busy at school and there have been many exciting learning opportunities that the children have been involved in.



Parliament

On Wednesday 29th January, Rachel Dodgson, a representative from the Parliament Education Engagement Service, visited school to lead an assembly with KS2 during which the children learnt about democracy in the United Kingdom. During the assembly, the children were each given a voting "pod" which was used for anonymous voting during the session - the percentage results were then displayed on the screen. Rachel explained the process of selecting MPs and the way in which bills are passed between the House of Commons and House of Lords before being given Royal assent by HM the Queen. After the assembly, Year 6 were treated to a workshop where the children had to work in groups to create their own parliamentary party. They were given a selection of manifesto pledges which they then whittled down to just four key election promises. They were tasked with presenting their reasoning to the whole class. The children then voted for the party they felt most represented them; The Star Party being the democratically elected successful party.

Enterprise

Before Christmas, Year 6 took part in an Enterprise project, culminating in the selling of products at the Christmas Fair. Following this, two teams were selected to represent Excalibur at an external

competition. On Tuesday 28th January, the two teams, Retro Rudolphs and Cheeky Little Elves, participated in the Alsager Community Trust Enterprise Competition at Alsager School. As part of the event, the teams had to share their Enterprise journey, including how they came up with their product ideas, how much profit they earned and what they would change in future. Both of our teams did fantastically, showcasing how superb our Year 6 children have been at the project, with Retro Rudolphs being crowned the overall Enterprise champions! Well done Year 6!

On Wednesday 29th January, Year 5 had a visit from Cheshire Fire Service to learn about staying safe. In the smoke tent simulation activity, the children experienced the way in which smoke behaves in a fire.
