# Attendance

As we are all aware, good attendance is critical to a child's progress at school. As a whole school our attendance rate has always been given a 'green' rag rating by the local authority, which is super.

Our attendance policy is explained fully on our website where it gives support around illness and attendance, etc. Please could I ask that whenever possible medical appointments are made outside of the school day? As parents ourselves, we know this is sometimes difficult but not impossible. Any time away from school does affect a pupil's learning.

You may have heard recently that the government is changing the criteria for 'persistent absenteeism'. Currently, 85% is the benchmark - the government will be increasing that to 90%. Currently, that would almost double the number of children at Excalibur considered as 'persistent absentees' and who the Education Welfare Officer would need to become involved with.

# <u>Help us to keep school safe</u>



We have noticed an increasing number of parents coming in to the school building in the morning. Whilst we operate an open door policy, should you really need to give a message to the class teacher, please be aware that from 8.50am the teachers are with their classes; offering a morning activity and getting brains ready for learning! Please make an appointment before 8.50am or after school if you have more than a quick message to discuss with the class teacher.

Unlike other schools, we don't line up or blow a whistle at 9am because we believe that a calm start to the day sets the tone for learning and we don't like to waste learning time. Please drop your child off promptly at the class door and then leave them to get ready - they are really very good at it!

Furthermore, if you need to visit the office – for safeguarding reasons - do not cut through the school building. It is important that parents use the front doors only; so that we know exactly who is in the building at any time. Remember - dinner money can be paid using parentmail or given to your child to hand in at register time in a named, labelled envelope. Thank you for your co-operation.
