

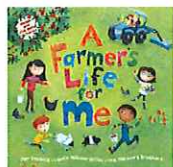
Reception weekly newsletter – Friday 15th May 2015



Our learning this week has stemmed from our visit to the farm and gardening in our outdoor area. We have planted more geraniums, fuschias, verbena and petunias. We moved our raspberry cane and some parlsey into our fruit/veg patch. A lot of fun was had digging this over and digging a big hole! We have sowed carrot and pepper seeds which we hope to add to our patch, once they have grown a little. We have put the seeds into our greenhouse and will be keeping a close eye on them. We have begun to discuss the life cycle of different plants and flowers and looked at different seeds. We found out that they come in different sizes and colours. We watched some time lapse photography of some of the things we have planted so we know what ours will look like!
