Harvest



The children sang and spoke really well in our harvest assembly last week and we were very proud of them. Thank you so much for your kind donations; we have sent £185.50 to Save the Children's Syrian Crisis appeal. After speaking with our pupils about the images they are seeing at the moment on TV screens; I know that they will be pleased that they have made a contribution to helping children in other places in the world.

We know that a few parents/carers were disappointed that they were unable to attend the assembly as the 120 seats were already taken. (Tickets were distributed on a first come basis and limited to 2 per request).The school office had much additional work load due to emails, phone calls and requests about tickets. As a school, we are currently reviewing this and appreciate your understanding and feedback.

After consultation with many Cheshire East schools, there are very few who offer the opportunity to parents/carers to attend harvest assemblies. Those that do tend to limit this by restricting the invitation to grandparents only or just reception class parents, for example.

At Excalibur we believe in an open door policy; we love to come together as a whole school; we love parents/carers to join us, but we are restricted by the size of the hall, the number of seats we have and - as I'm sure you will have seen - a very busy, efficient front office. Harvest and Easter are not performances, but short assemblies. Curriculum commitments mean we cannot repeat assemblies. All parents are invited to their child's class assembly during the academic year. For our Easter assembly, we are hoping to be able go to St.Mary's church which has a larger capacity. We welcome any feedback which may help for the future.
