The children are still requesting 'Funny bones' stories so we have enjoyed listening to those too. We played a game and used our sense of smell to guess different smells with most children correctly identifying coffee, mint, lemon and chocolate! We also enjoyed smelling, and tasting, the delicious gingerbread as we made gingerbread men on Tuesday, eating them for snack.
