In Year 1, the children have been working so hard. They have been following a series of lessons based on the story the 'Monkeys and Hats'. have named, sorted and made patterns with shapes and have found out about their properties. The children have also enjoyed learning some new songs using British Sign Language. Year 4

using expanded noun phrases and prepositional sentence starters to help create interesting, descriptive sentences ready for the setting description that they will be creating next week. The afternoons have been a hive of activity as well! The children have been investigating food chains in science and setting the *ground work* for their geography topic by exploring how the earth beneath our feet is structured. It has been great to see everyone staying active whilst at home, whether it be by taking part in PE activities or by going out for walks with family. Well done everyone, keep it up!

Year 5

This week, Year 5 have been learning about prime numbers and factors plus square and cube numbers. The children have worked remarkably well and have persevered with some tricky work. In English, they have written a letter from the perspective of the protagonist of our class reading book, Michael. After spending months stranded upon a tropical island, Michael finds a washed up coke bottle on the beach. He decides to write a letter to his parents letting them know that he is alive and clues about how they can find and rescue him.

Year 6

This week, Year 6 have worked hard across all subjects. In English, they completed their setting descriptions, the first piece of writing linked with their book focus: *the Invention of Hugo Cabret*. In maths, they applied their knowledge of area to find the areas of rectilinear shapes. Also, through group Teams sessions, the children worked diligently to get a grasp of the new concept of algebra.

As part of their study of *Lights, Camera, Action*, our Year 6 children have improved their geographical knowledge of countries around the world with a focus on some international movie studios. In science,

following on from their investigation into heart rate prior to Christmas, they learnt about how the heart works. They also practised their juggling skills in PE, explored compound time in music and looked into the importance of money matters in PSHE. Keep up the great work, Year 6.
